

The World Feeder Fishing Championships will take place on the River Lee at Nadrid Coachford on July 19th and 20th. The new Greenway will be the main venue for most of the teams and spectators are invited to view the fisherman in action. 25 countries are taking part in the competition and hotels, B&Bs and private accommodation are booked out all around the area. The welcoming committee



for the championships has been busy decorating the village with buntings and the flags of the participating countries. O'Donovan Engineering have put in a huge amount of time and effort in erecting 25 flags and flagpoles on Rooves Bridge representing the participating countries. The shops are stocked up and the Public Houses in the village have music lined up for the weekend of the competition. O'Riordan's Bar and O' Callaghan's Bar will be serving breakfast each morning throughout the competition. O' Riordan's will host a BBQ on Wednesday with live music throughout the week. Breathnachs Bar also have live music and O'Callaghan's Bar are offering a full carvery lunch each day during the competition. Dripsey is also involved in the championships with some of the teams competing near Griffins Garden Centre. The Dripsey Community Association have decorated the village and the bridge with some beautiful hanging baskets, planters and boats with the help and support of Griffins Garden Centre.

The Chairperson of the Community Council and Welcoming Committee, Deirdre O'Donovan said, "we are delighted that the World Championships are coming to the village, It's a huge boost for the area and is giving everyone a sense of pride in our village, the river and the Lee valley. We are asking everyone to make the visitors from the 25 countries feel very welcome and offer them a Cead Míle Fáilte. We hope the championships are a great success for the organisers and that we see many more events like this on the river. These international competitions are very welcome to the economy of the village and we are looking forward to many more similar events in the coming years. I would like to pay special tribute to Tommy Lawton of the NCFFI for helping to bring this world event to Coachford and to the Inniscarra Lake Tourism Development Committee for developing the venue. Excitement around Coachford, Dripsey and all along the river is great to see and already the influx of the participating countries is having a positive impact on the community."



The Coachford Tidy Towns are busy making sure the approach roads to the village are Litter Free and have collected bags and bags of bottles, cans and disposable coffee cups which have surfaced following the recent hedge trimming. The group have also been cleaning the local Mullinhassig Waterfall area to ensure it is tidy if any of the visiting tourists decide to explore the local beauty spot. Flowers have been planted and new featured planters are almost completed. Walls have been power washed and repainted and the village is looking fabulous. Cork County Council have been making sure that potholes are filled and have em-

barked on a major clean up of the Rooves Bridge area. The ESB who are one of the major sponsors of the event have been ensuring the venue is in perfect order, the water is good and that the river is full of fish!

On Thursday July 17th, the official opening of the World Championship takes place in Coachford. The 25 teams, Ireland, Italy, South Africa, Hungary, Austria, England, Netherlands, Germany, Russia, Belarus, Latvia, Slovakia, Sweden, France, Belgium, Spain, Czech Republic, Serbia, Portugal, Denmark, Romania, Moldova, Lithuania, Ukraine and Kazakhstan will gather at the square in the evening and there will be a parade of nations through the village to the GAA complex where the official opening will take place. Unfortunately due to the capacity of the GAA Hall and the number of teams and their support crews entry to the Official opening has to be limited. However everyone is welcome to come along to the 'Parade of Nations' and enjoy the party atmosphere. There will be live music from the Ballingeary Pipe Band, Face Painting, Balloon Modeler, Sweets and fun to be enjoyed. Children are asked to come along in their favourite jersey to add some color to the event. The Championships will start at 7.00am on Saturday morning and will finish each day at around 4pm. The Closing Ceremony and awarding of medals takes place again in Coachford on Sunday July 20th in the GAA complex.


Festival Fever on its Way
